Skiing Two Million Vertical Feet

Many people set New Year's goals like eating less turkey and exercising more but on News Year's Day 2010 ski mountaineer Greg Hill of Revelstoke B.C. headed out his door with the super human goal of skiing two million vertical feet in a single year under human power. On December 30th with one day to spare Greg reached his goal on Rogers Pass surrounded by family and friends.

To accomplish his goal Greg skied a total of 266 days in Canada during the Winter and spent the Summer in Chile and Argentina averaging 7,519 feet per day. To give some perspective, two million feet is the equivalent of climbing Mount Everest 69 times.
